



Special Issue Proposal Guidelines

August 2021

The journal *Renaissance and Reformation/Renaissance et Réforme* is currently receiving proposals for special issues of the journal. Special issues are edited by guest editors and dedicated to a particular theme relevant to the field of early modern studies. The journal is interdisciplinary and bilingual. Articles can be published in either English or French.

Each proposal should contain the following:

- A description of the proposed theme (1500-2000 words) highlighting its significance to early modern studies and potential readership. The journal will be particularly interested in proposals that speak to an interdisciplinary and multiculturally broad readership.
- A table of contents (typically an introduction and 7 to 8 articles of 8,000 words: minimum of 6 articles, maximum of 12)
- Abstracts of the articles (100-150 words each)
- Two-page CVs of the editors; short biographies of the contributors. You may attach urls for online CVs.
- An outline of the production process up to manuscript submission.

Submission Process

- Please send proposals to the attention of Megan Armstrong, Associate Editor, marmstr@mcmaster.ca. The decision regarding special issues is taken by the *R&R* editorial team, with the input of its editorial board.
- After submission, all manuscripts will go through a process of peer-review, author's revisions, and copy-editing.
